Oratorical: Topic – How to Change the World with Optimism. Open to contestants under the age of 19 as of October 1, 2023, and who has not yet completed Secondary School. There is no minimum age. Winners from Zone Competitions to be sent to Chair Marijke by April 29th. The winners will compete at District in Barrie on May 4th. Note there is no meal this year, so contestants should eat prior.
